

# **General Objectives (1)**

# Why is it important to consider IP in H2020?

- **-best efforts** commitment of participants to **exploit their own results** (Art.28 Grant Agreement)
- -impact and feasibility of the implementation of the project proposal
- Results of research and development activities require further and often substantial investments to take them to market
- -avoid future conflicts among the consortium





#### Background

The management of intellectual property and the use of standards support innovation by providing an important basis for developing solutions and are essential for market update.

The European IPR Helpdesk and CEN-CENELEC seek to link the worlds of research and innovation to standardisation on the one hand and IP management on the other hand by the so-called "integrated Approach". The integrated Approach provides a mechanism to make sure that standardisation and early-stage IP management mechanisms are integrated in research and innovation projects. It aims at:

- . ratising awareness of the benefits of standardisation and IP management in the research and innovation process;
- . transferring research results and outcomes of innovation activities into standardisation;
- . fully exploiting project results and the functions of standards for research and innovation activities in order to increase the competitiveness of the EU.




